

Rylie Theuerkauf of Tenafly voted North Jersey Girls Basketball Player of the Week

After four days of voting, Tenafly sophomore guard Rylie Theuerkauf has been selected as the North Jersey Girls Basketball Player of the Week.

Theuerkauf's 48 points on Jan. 26 against Bergen Tech were the most in the state on opening day, and she was subbed out of that game in the third quarter. She added 24 points in a loss to a tough Teaneck team despite getting double-teamed and being in foul trouble during the first half.

Here were the other nominees:

Symiaha Brown-Cobb

Eastside sophomore point guard

In the Ghosts' season-opening win over Bergen Tech, Brown-Cobb tallied a double-double with 27 points and 10 steals, and she added six rebounds and six assists. She also sank a pair of three-pointers and converted five free throws.

Katy Gashler

Westwood senior forward/center

The four-year starter eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for her career in a Thursday, Jan. 28 win over Mahwah. During a 2-1 week, Gashler averaged 15.6 points, 9.6 rebounds and 3.3 blocks per game, with double-doubles against Mahwah (19 points, 13 rebounds) and Passaic Tech (10 points, 10 rebounds).

Rachel Gordon

Teaneck junior guard

During a 2-0 week, Gordon averaged 14.5 points and 6.0 rebounds to help her team rise to first in the Big North-National. She had 18 points and eight rebounds in a win over NV/Demarest, then tallied 11 points and four boards versus Tenafly before exiting with a cut over her eye late in the first half.

Caitlin Nader

River Dell senior guard

Nader averaged 14.0 points per game in leading the Hawks to a 2-0 start, both overall and in Big North-Patriot play. In their Jan. 27 opener against Westwood, she had 10 points to tie junior Sarah Vanderbeck for the team lead in scoring. One day later, at Pascack Hills, she poured in 18 points to key a 52-43 win.
